**PEER TUTORING:** Cedarbrae offers a Peer Tutoring course (**GPP3O**). This course prepares students to act in leadership and peer support roles. The student will develop skills in communication, interpersonal relations, teamwork, conflict management and leadership.



## INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

Interdisciplinary studies courses provide students with opportunities to understand the diverse perspectives of and the links among discrete subjects/disciplines and to develop their knowledge and skills beyond the scope of individual disciplines to solve problems, make decisions, and present new findings. Students will integrate general interdisciplinary concepts, skills, models, resources, technologies, and strategies with specific content and approaches from diverse areas of the curriculum, which can be adapted to reflect the context of the specific interdisciplinary studies courses.

**At Cedarbrae for 2012 – 2013 we are offering the following interdisciplinary courses:**

Financial Securities	INF4U1 [p. 4]
Media	INM4U1 or INM4O1 [p. 7]
Sports and Entertainment Marketing	IEM4O1 or IEM4U [p. 4]

**\*\*NOTE: All interdisciplinary courses will appear on the transcript with the code IDC. Therefore, students can only take one interdisciplinary course of the same grade and course type (only one of INF4U1 or INM4U1 or IEM4U and only one of INM4O1 or IEM4O1). If a student took more than one of these courses the second would appear as a duplicate credit on the transcript and it would not count as a credit for Diploma purposes.
