

## **Course Description & Evaluation Statement**

**Course Title:** Cooperative Education

**Course Code:** COOP 2 or 4

**Prerequisite(s):** Individual Assessment interview + (16 credits OYAP)

### **Course Description**

Cooperative education offers students an opportunity to earn high school credits through a course that integrates classroom theory and learning experiences in a workplace, which enables students to apply and refine the knowledge and skills acquired in a related high school course.

By participating in cooperative education, students develop their skills, interests and professional connections while still in high school, in almost any industry. Students can also participate in a number of central programs, working in occupations in healthcare, hospitality, uniformed services, banking and finance, or drama. Students can also participate in the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program through their cooperative education courses.

Cooperative education involves a partnership between education and business, industry, agriculture, labour, or community organizations that includes students, teachers, parents, employers, and placement supervisors. Additional participants may be involved in the case of exceptional students and other students with special needs.

Co-op is beneficial for students who plan to enter university, college, apprenticeships and the workplace after high school. Students can also take cooperative education courses more than once, and up to two cooperative education courses can count towards a student's compulsory credits.

### **Course Strands**

Pre-placement, Work Placement and Integration

#### **Assessment & Evaluation**

The first two weeks students attend classes where pre-placement lessons, activities and speakers occur before students are released to their supervisor at a monitored and approved location where conditions of work are observed by the Coop teacher. During the Placement at the employment location students are required to maintain a reflective journal, usually online. Students must also follow the rules and regulations of the school and the Coop program set out during the pre-placement period. Weekly hour sheet are submitted and signed by the supervisor (supervisor as defined by the ESA Ontario). Over the course of the work Placement students meet periodically at the school to receive additional education on safety awareness and workplace success essential skills. After the Placement term students are required to give a presentation as their culminating activity that details their experience and how it fits into the career path they chose to explore. Student research and evaluate post-secondary, financial, work environment and life styles then make connection with their Co-op work placement.

*The primary goal of assessment and evaluation is to improve student learning. Through assessment, students receive comments on their work and suggestions for improvement. Through evaluation, students receive marks for their work. Seventy percent of the course grade will be based on the student's demonstration of their most consistent level of achievement on term work. This includes assessments of supervisor performance feedback. Thirty percent of the grade will be based on the student's achievement on the culminating strand which is a summative presentation about their coop experience.*

### **Methods Used for Assessment & Evaluation:**
